Remember to use adjectives, nouns and have an organised plot of your story.</p>	<p><b>Health and Wellbeing:</b> Find a healthy winter warming recipe e.g. soup. Write out the recipe. If you have the ingredients you could even make this!</p>	<p><b>Art:</b> Look out your window and create a detailed drawing of what you can see.</p>	<p><b>Technology:</b> Design your own super sledge or skateboard. Label it and make a list of the materials you would need to build it.</p>	<p><b>Research Activity:</b> Research, record and bring in some fascinating facts about winter.</p>
<p><b>Science:</b> Investigate snow and ice. How long does it take to melt in different places?</p>	<p><b>Literacy:</b> Choose a book of your choice and list the verbs, nouns and adjectives you can find in them.</p>	<p><b>Literacy:</b> Make a list of 10 polar animals and put them in alphabetical order.</p>	<p><b>Maths:</b> Make a TV guide for your favourite TV programmes and display the times using analogue and digital times.</p>	<p><b>Health and Wellbeing:</b> Choose your favourite song of the moment and create a dance routine. You can show and teach the dance to the rest of the class.</p>
<p><b>Art:</b> Take interesting photos of anything snowy. If using a tablet or phone have a go at looking at the different settings you can use to enhance your pictures.</p>	<p><b>Technology:</b> Build a Snow Castle, if possible take a picture to show the class.</p>	<p><b>Maths:</b> Play maths games on Top Marks website.</p>	<p><b>Maths:</b> Revise the names of 2d and 3d shapes, practise writing the names of them.</p>	<p><b>Weather</b> Record the weather conditions for the days you are off. Try and find out what the temperature is and the wind direction and speed if possible (maybe watch the news for this) Take a photo or two of your fun in the snow.</p>
	<p><b>Numeracy:</b> Practise your multiplication and division facts.</p>	<p><b>Science:</b> Compare weather forecasts this can be done through newspapers or looking on different weather websites: BBC WEATHER MET OFFICE STV WEATHER</p>	<p><b>Art:</b> Create a snow sculpture.</p>	<p><b>Health and Wellbeing:</b> Make up a circuit of activities you can do in the snow.
